Used as a shopping basket for carrying items to and from market Music Basket with lid (contains the musical instruments listed below). Metal shaker with gourd x 1. Musical instruments x 6 Drum rattles x 2. (in Music Basket) Metal shaker x 1. Mbira x 1. Wood & grass shaker x 1. **African Music & musical** Informative A4 booklet with useful text and line drawings (in Instruments booklet x 1 shopping basket). (in Music Basket) For general use, carrying of produce to and from market, balanced Open Baskets x 2 on the head. Grown and produced locally. Has lots of everyday uses including Sisal rope leading animals, tying up containers etc. Cooking stove / Jiko Most people in rural and urban areas have these stoves for cooking. They are filled with charcoal; opening and closing the small vent on the side regulates the heat. Cooking pot / Surfuria Most homes have a selection of these pots as they can be used on charcoal stoves and electric cookers. Beans x 1 bag Most gardens have some type of bean growing in them. Cooked with maize, these make the traditional staple dish amaenjera. Most gardens have maize growing in them. Cooked with beans, Maize x 1 bag this makes the traditional staple dish amaenjera. Maize is also ground into flour and used to make mandazis. Groundnuts / Mjugu x 1 These are roasted in a sufuria with a little oil and salt, being served bag to visitors as a snack. Sugar cane x 1 stick Grown locally. This is processed and made into sugar. As cane, children chew it raw, tearing off the hard woody outer layer with their teeth. Often sold as a snack it is very popular. I adle x 1 Made from a locally grown gourd, cut in half with the flesh and seeds scooped out. Can also be used as bowls, spoons and for storage, when the top is removed to leave a small hole. **Brush** Made from local grasses. Paper flour bag Locally grown wheat and maize is milled to produce flour. This is then sold on stalls or in shops. Round board x 1 Every household has at least one of these. The main use is for rolling out dough used for mandazis. Made from recycled tin cans. A small quantity of oil can be easily Oil funnel poured from larger containers without waste - oil is often sold like this in the markets. Made from recycled tin can and filled with paraffin. These are used Lamp / taa x 1 a lot in rural villages and other homes where there is no electricity. Wooden Headrest x 1 Used in some rural villages, mainly by elders.
