Large drums x 2	Available on request.		
Music Basket with lid	Used as a shopping basket for carrying items to and from market (contains the musical instruments listed below).		
Musical instruments x 6 (in Music Basket)	Drum rattles x 2. Metal shaker with gourd x 1. Metal shaker x 1. Mbira x 1. Wood & grass shaker x 1.		
African Music & musical Instruments booklet x 1 (in Music Basket)	Informative A4 booklet with useful text and line drawings (in shopping basket).		
Open Baskets x 2	For general use, carrying of produce to and from market, balanced on the head.		
Sisal rope	Grown and produced locally. Has lots of everyday uses including leading animals, tying up containers etc.		
Cooking stove / Jiko	Most people in rural and urban areas have these stoves for cooking. They are filled with charcoal; opening and closing the small vent on the side regulates the heat.		
Cooking pot / Surfuria	Most homes have a selection of these pots as they can be used on charcoal stoves and electric cookers.		
Beans x 1 bag	Most gardens have some type of bean growing in them. Cooked with maize, these make the traditional staple dish amaenjera .		
Maize x 1 bag	Most gardens have maize growing in them. Cooked with beans, this makes the traditional staple dish amaenjera . Maize is also ground into flour and used to make mandazis .		
Groundnuts / Mjugu x 1 bag	These are roasted in a sufuria with a little oil and salt, being served to visitors as a snack.		
Sugar cane x 1 stick	Grown locally. This is processed and made into sugar. As cane, children chew it raw, tearing off the hard woody outer layer with their teeth. Often sold as a snack it is very popular.		
Ladle x 1	Made from a locally grown gourd, cut in half with the flesh and seeds scooped out. Can also be used as bowls, spoons and for storage, when the top is removed to leave a small hole.		
Brush	Made from local grasses.		
Paper flour bag	Locally grown wheat and maize is milled to produce flour. This is then sold on stalls or in shops.		
Round board x 1	Every household has at least one of these. The main use is for rolling out dough used for mandazis .		
Oil funnel	Made from recycled tin cans. A small quantity of oil can be easily poured from larger containers without waste – oil is often sold like this in the markets.		
Lamp / taa x 1	Made from recycled tin can and filled with paraffin. These are used a lot in rural villages and other homes where there is no electricity.		
Wooden Headrest x 1	Used in some rural villages, mainly by elders. It is also used as a portable stool. See accompanying A4 laminated photo.

Soap x 1 bar	Soap is sold in small shops and in the markets, often as cut offs from much larger bars.		
Fabric x 5 pieces	Kangas x 3; orange patterned fabrics with many uses – a wrap skirt, to carry babies on backs, to wrap and carry objects. Kitenga x 1; yellow with butterflies. Used mainly for making into suits and outfits though can also be worn as a wrap skirt. When worn by men wrapped around the waist, it is known as a lesso . Kangas are made of loosely woven cotton, whereas kitenga are made of tightly woven cotton. Red & Blue check (worn by Masai as a blanket).
