

## ZAMBIA COLLECTIONS - Quick tips for teachers

Activities to support use of Zambia 1 (Z1) and Zambia 2 (Z2) collections at key stages 1 and 2, based on National Curriculum Requirements 2014

Teaching ideas and thumbnails of all the photos are in the photopacks. Question & answer sheets are in the folders with the Collection Lists - see end	Z1 Blue folder Z2 Pink folder
10 children's, illustrated books in Bemba <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can the children work out the stories?</li> <li>• Re-tell them to their group/class/another class</li> <li>• In a group dramatize a story and dress up using chitenge (a basketful in each collection)</li> </ul>	Z1  Baskets in Z1 and Z2
Z. stories are often traditional tales; there are some in the Zambian school book <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Children re-tell/ dramatize a traditional U.K. tale/poem</li> <li>• Make a collection for others using various methods of presentation: pop-up book, concertina book, cartoon</li> <li>• Use Z. instruments - enough for a whole class - to accompany drama</li> </ul>	Z1  South Africa Music collection
The colourful chitenge collection can be used to help <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• find out about traditional clothes and costume--- with the help of the various photopacks</li> <li>• look at colour and design in art</li> <li>• shape and symmetry, direction of movement and angle in maths</li> </ul>	Baskets in Z1 and Z2
Use photos of buildings <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• to find 2D and 3D shapes in traditional and modern Z. buildings--</li> <li>• Children given/ make nets of shapes to cut out and make model buildings for a Z. landscape -bush village, farm, township, town.</li> </ul> <p><i>The Buildings Photopack includes extra photos and details of how to run this activity in Z2 Collection</i></p>	Buildings photopack, Z1
Everyday artefacts <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make a home corner</li> <li>• Make 2 home-corners, one Z. the other U.K.</li> <li>• Build in time for discussion on similarities and differences; what did I find out that surprised me? (stereotypes and preconceived ideas). Photopacks support this.</li> </ul>	Z1 and Z2 Z2 focuses on cooking and food  Z1 and Z2
Both collections contain interesting articles made from local materials which have been made into decorative, functional or tourist items: wood, copper, malachite/ cotton, clay etc.	Z1 and Z2
Some items are imports indicating trade links e.g. enamelled bowls from China.
